The Dangers of Dry Mouth

Xerostomia, which is also referred to as dry mouth, is a result of absent or decreased salivary flow. Dry mouth can be a symptom of various medical conditions, a side effect of head and neck radiation, a side effect of combining medications, or can be related to decreased salivary gland

Saliva serves an important role in antimicrobial action, natural cleansing of the oral environment, control of acids, retention of dentures, remineralization and lubrication. The absence of adequate salivary flow can result in complications such as burning of the mouth, halitosis (bad breath), difficulty swallowing, difficulty with speech, infection of the oral tissues, such as candidiasis, gum disease and eventual tooth loss. Xerostomia causes increased plaque accumulation which can result in a greater risk of tooth decay.

The presence of dry mouth increases your risk of developing dental complications, therefore we recommend regular visits to help closely monitor your dental condition. Extra measures are recommended to help protect your teeth and gums such as:

- Regular professional cleanings with your Dental Hygienist
- Regular fluoride applications at your Continuing Care (cleaning) visits
- Diligent plaque-removal strategies at home
- At-home sodium fluoride rinse, such as OptiRinse™
- Salivary substitutes, such as Biotene™ or Moi-Stir™, in more severe cases there are prescription options that can be prescribed by your doctor
- Non-abrasive toothpaste that is free of sodium lauryl sulfate such as Remin™ or Sensodyne Repair and Protect™
- Salivary stimulants such as xylitol mints or gum
- · Frequent water intake
- · Frequent dental examinations

Dry mouth not only affects your dental health, it can also affect your quality of life, please talk to us about strategies to help.

Frequently Asked Questions...Answered!

"Why do I still need fluoride at my dental visits? Isn't this just for kids?" Topical fluoride applications are recommended for every age on an individual basis. Even as adults, we are still at risk of developing dental decay from factors such as inadequate home care, exposure to acids in diet or from a naturally acidic

oral environment, history of having tooth decay, dry mouth, etc. Topical fluoride treatments recommended at your visits and from sodium-fluoridated toothpaste help to strengthen the teeth's enamel to protect the teeth from demineralization caused by the above factors. Children, whose teeth are still developing, benefit from systemic fluoride, like the fluoride mineral found in water or through supplements. The systemic fluoride aids in strengthening the enamel during the development process. Though fluoridated-water has been proven to aid significantly in decay-prevention in children, it is no longer in our community's water, it was removed entirely in 2010. If you have any questions about your options for fluoride, or if you want to discuss what is right for you and your family, please ask at your next visit!

"Why are dental X-rays recommended at my routine visits when I don't even have any concerns or pain?" Periodic, routine dental X-rays are recommended at your visits to help completely assess your dental condition. Tooth decay is often diagnosed early through these X-rays, this allows us to treat these areas more predictably and before you experience any discomfort. The time interval between these dental X-rays can vary depending on your history of tooth decay and other risk factors, and is considered on an individual basis. The contribution of overall radiation exposure through dental, digital X-rays is minor. If you have questions regarding dental radiation, please ask at your next visit.
