What is Xylitol?

Xylitol is a natural way to prevent tooth decay. It is a sweetener commonly found in fruits and vegetables and is produced in your body as a normal metabolic intermediary.

Xylitol can be found in health food stores in the form of gum, lozenges, and powder, and as an ingredient in many dental products such as toothpastes and rinses.

Dental Benefits of Xylitol:

- Reduces the risk of tooth decay by controlling oral bacteria
- Reduces plaque formation and adherence to tooth enamel
- Increases salivary flow to repair and remineralization damaged tooth enamel
- Has medical, antibacterial properties.
 Studies show that when administered to children, xylitol reduced the rate of upper respiratory and middle ear infections.

What is Gum Recession?



Receding gums, also known as gum recession, is the loss of gum tissue resulting in exposure of the root surface of a tooth. It can be isolated or affect any number of your teeth on both the inner and outer surfaces of the teeth. Gum recession doesn't happen overnight, and in the majority of cases will happen progressively over a number of years. It is most commonly caused by aggressive toothbrushing but can also be the result of clenching or grinding your teeth, an improper bite relationship, or inadequate plaque removal resulting in the build-up of tartar along the gum line.

Common signs and symptoms of gum recession include:

- · Teeth appear longer than normal
- The roots of teeth are visible, which can result in a change in tooth colour toward the gum line
- Spaces between teeth seem larger
- Increased sensitivity to hot/cold or when touching along the gum line
- · Cavities occur along the gum line

Depending on the severity of your gum recession, treatment options can vary. In moderate to severe cases often a referral to a gum specialist will be recommended to further explore your treatment options.

Remember, healthy gums never bleed. Never, ever!
